In this list there are 110 cultivars and 10 species or varieties. Let's all give Mrs. Wasyluka a great big "thank you" for the work of compilation. Dr. Wister says there are now only about 30 nurseries which grow lilacs and here you have the listings of 15 of them. Please note: anyone making remarks about the one error in alphabetizing that your ed knows about can have the doubtful joy of doing this for the next list published.

There are no wholesale nurseries in this list because they should not be asked to ship to retail customers and your nurseryman will not order a single plant from any of them. There are also no listings of places that will not ship to you--for obvious reasons.

It is my sad duty to announce the sudden passing away of Dirk Eveleens Maarse on the 24th of May, 1975 at the age of 94. Mr. Eveleens Maarse had been heading the Aalsmeer firm of Topsvoort and, in this position, had been breeding many currently popular lilacs. To mention a few: Sensation (the unique bicolored lilac, so popular in the U.S.A.), Peerless Pink, Excellent, Flora 153, etc.

I have a very warm heart for the ILS and I love lilacs. I am planning to start propagating a large collection of named lilacs from around the globe for our garden in France where we have a large space and an ideal soil and climate. There I also will be able to do breeding.

My main aims are to breed: 1--very dwarf and compact large-flowered lilacs of the vulgaris or hybrid vulgaris type. This type will without doubt increasethe popularity of lilacs considerably as it will make lilacs suitable for small gardens. Also may more hobbiests can afford breeding as a hobby. 2--very late-blooming lilacs of fast and easy growth, suitable for cut flowers and preferably single whites. 3--the same as under 2 for extreme earliness.

I will need small quantities of open pollinated seeds of as many named varieties (cultivars) of vulgaris lilacs as possible. The purpose will be to find out which seed parent will give the fastest and best rootstocks. The help of ILS members in getting sources will be most welcome.
