Charles D. Holetich The President There is a tree lilac (S. pekinensis) at the edge of my perennial border. It usually blooms beautifully at the appointed time in July. Four years ago, the eratic behaviour began with a burst of bloom in September. This bloom seemed to be all from the terminal buds. The following year, the terminal buds having been spent, it bloomed from lateral buds. Each branch was covered with small, lacy clusters of bloom. The effect was stunning.

Last year, there were fewer blossoms - quite unimpressive.

This year there was a good display and, to my amazement, late September brought another display. The whole top of the tree was covered with large trusses of blossoms. I returned from a month-long trip on September 29, two days after the hurricane. The weight of the bloom had been too much and the tree (about 12' tall) lay prostrate on the ground. I pruned off an arm load of blossoms and buds before pulling the tree upright and settling the roots back in the soil. Again, the bloom had all been from terminal buds.

Will I have a tree covered with lace next year?

Will I have a tree at all?
