The Flower City and Highland Botanical Park are awaiting your arrival in Rochester, New York for the 17th Annual Convention of the ILS. This year marks the Centennial of the Rochester Park System. Plan on attending and share our year-long celebration of parks.

Program highlights include a panel discussion on the influence of the Lilac on the local community over the past 90 years. Ken Mudge, of Cornell University, will speak on Micro-Propagation of Lilacs and James Kelly, Taxonomist for the Monroe County Parks Department, will speak on Select Lilac Cultivars.

A very special Sunday tour will take us to the new Lilac collection at Cornell Plantations and we will stop in Clyde, New York to help members Bill and Lois Utley, celebrate the dedication of Grape Hil Garden.

To article on Lilac Mildew in the November 1987 Newsletter

Under control of mildew in the article on Page 4 of the November Newsletter it stated that Benlate would control mildew (it will) and that it should be mixed at 2 teaspoons per gallon of water (that's correct) or 80 ozs per 100 gallons. THAT'S NOT CORRECT. It should read 8 ozs per 100 gallons. I'm not even sure you could get 80 ozs dissolved much less get it to run through a spray nozzle.

If you keep your Newsletters, would you please go back and change the 80 to 8 before somebody actually tries to mix in 80 ozs - that's 5 lbs!


